Subject: Statement to be made by SA Wright at Press Conference

Mr. Daly per our conversation on 3/12/02, rather than physically appear at a future press conference to be held by my attorneys (Mr. Klayman and Mr. Shippers) in Washington, D.C., I would like to make a brief statement by telephone. Since the Prepublication Review Unit has granted me permission to publish my mission statement, Mr. Klayman says I am allowed to read my mission statement during the press conference. Instead of reading my mission statement at the press conference, I would rather make a very brief statement.

After all these attorneys have done, I feel obligated to do something. I informed the attorneys that in leu of being present at the press conference, I would be willing to make a brief statement by phone only if the FBI approves the statement. They have agreed with this request. The statement is as follows:

## Good Morning,

My name is Bob Wright and I am a 12 year veteran special agent of the FBI. Unfortunately, due to the sensitivity of my past assignments, I am not prepared to make any public statements at this time.

However, on February 5, 2002, I was authorized by the FBI to release for publication a Mission Statement I drafted on June 9, 2001. My attorneys, Mr Shippers and Mr. Klayman are releasing this Mission Statement along with a signed sworn statement I provided to the FBI on March 21, 2000, regarding the allegation of a Muslim FBI Agent who claimed I questioned, among other things, his loyalty to the United States of America. Thank you.

Immediately after stating "Thank you," I would hang up the phone to prevent any questions from being asked by reporters.
